## Views of Panellist - 1



(Mr. Rajeev Gupta, CEO, Ranchi Mall)

- \* No need to panic. Main priority is to stay safe
- Utilize this time to understand ourselves
- Work towards becoming physically and emotionally stable
- Knowledge enrichment
- Although all IT companies are not recruiting, but some are recruiting online. On boarding process is also online.
- Lot of opportunities for Tech. Entrepreneurs, mainly in healthcare sector

### Views of Panellist - 2



#### (Mr. Rohit Sharma, AGM, Extramarks Education)

- COVID-19 facilitated scaling up of EduTech Sector. In the last 40 days, Extramarks has acquired around 2 million students from different parts of the country. This sector is recruiting now and will continue recruiting post COVId-19 also.
- Students while working in their sector can "Learn while Earning"
- Opportunities are there in Teaching, Product Development, Marketing and Sales, Technology Development/Integration
- Fresh graduates can start their career as an Intern and on the basis of performance can get absorbed . Pay package is very attractive. They can build an excellent career.
- **Work environment in the industry became digital** . Students have to get used to it.
- Skills expected Confidence to convince , Communication, Interpersonal, Technical
- Advice to students Update CV, Have LinkedIn profile to get connected with prospective employers, learn basic skills in using digital tools like videoconferencing.

### Views of Panellist 3



#### (Dr. Ratikanta Das, Head – HR, Larsen & Toubro)

- Although due to lockdown, most of the manufacturing sector is not operating, continuous machinery plants, process plant, mines, power generation etc. are working
- COVID-19 may help in revival of manufacturing sector in India as the negative effects of Globalization are being seen
- Post COVID-19, there may be good job opportunities for fresh B.Tech and Polytechnic (DIT) students
- However, students should be patient , as it will take time . Meanwhile, they should focus on improving themselves



### Concluding Remarks (Prof. ORS Rao, Vice-Chancellor)

- Earlier, IT was a separate domain, but now IT is integrated into every Industry and creation of new type of industries
- Now Technology driven sectors like BankTech, FinTech, InsureTech, EduTech, HealthTech etc. are hiring and will continue the same post COVID-19 also . So, Students must look for opportunity in this sunrise industry for careers
- However, most of the recruiters are delaying joining dates. They are expecting students to get ready to perform from day-one.
- COVID-19 changed our Work and Life styles ,wherein digital is part of life. Students must learn how to be comfortable with it and perform in the new environment.
